ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PANDIT JAWAHARLAL NEHRU COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE,  
KARAIKAL

INAUGURATION:

An Agricultural College was started at Karaikal in the name of great patriot and the first Premier of India late Shri.Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru. The college was inaugurated on 2.10.1987, the birthday of Mahatma Gandhi, by the Hon'ble Chief Minister Shri.M.C.H.Farook under the presidentship of the Hon'ble Minister for Agriculture Shri.V.Govindarajan. The first Dean of the college was appointed on 28.9.1987 on deputation from Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore. The college was brought under the management of autonomous society since 1.12.'87. The society is named as Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru College of Agriculture(Karaikal)Society.

VENUE:

Initially the office of the Dean of the Agricultural College was located in the premises of the office of Additional Director of Agriculture, Karaikal. Initial work connected with release of advertisement on admission, printing of applications and drawal of staff members on deputation was undertaken at this office. The Agricultural College was then housed at Arignar Anna Government Arts College, Karaikal. The auditorium of the Arignar Anna Government Arts College was allotted for accommodating the college and its class room. The auditorium was divided into 3 compartments by rolling shutters. One room was utilised for the Dean and the office staff. Another room was utilised as staff room. The third one was converted into a class room. The laboratories of the Arignar Anna Government Arts College, Karaikal are being utilised for conducting lab oriented practicals. The Instructional farm was organised at the State Seed Farm, Madur for conducting field oriented practical classes. One staff quarters at Madur Farm was given to this college for accomadating teaching staff during practical classes. Another Hall was also provided for initiation of practical classes. A hall in the office of the Chief Educational Officer, Karaikal was taken for conducting theory classes. Anticipating the requirement for the second year classes, two more buildings are hired out on rent for accommodating laboratory with advanced equipments and library. Additional buildings are being hired out on rent for organising

laboratories for different subjects to be offered in the second year because the courses offered during the second year required additional facilities which are not available in the laboratories of the Arignar Anna Government Arts College, Karaikal.

Two hostels, one for men and another for women are run by the college. A hostel for men was situated in the first floor of the Excursion Centre, Karaikal. A hostel for women was located in a private building in V.G.Nagar, Karaikal during the first year. Thirty men students and 12 women students were the inmates of the hostel. With the increase in number of the women students during the second year after the admission of the 88-89 batch, the hostel was shifted to another private building in Bharathiar Road, Karaikal. Two more private buildings in the Karaikal town have been taken on rent to accommodate hostel for the men students since the first floor of the Excursion Centre has been vacated in January '89. The present strength of inmates of the hostels comprises 66 men and 22 women students.

In course of time the college and hostels will be shifted to Sorakudy and Suprayapuram villages after the acquisition of lands in these villages and construction of buildings in the proposed site.

#### ADMINISTRATION AND STAFF POSITION:

The overall functioning and administration of the college is governed by the society through various committees at present.

In order to facilitate the Dean to incur day to day expenses and implementation of the college into functioning, a Transitory Body was constituted before the registration of the society. This Transitory Body was vested with the powers of approving the expenditure and the initial action of the Dean required for the start of the college. The Transitory Body met only once on 16.12.87 and transacted its business. It approved the release of advertisement, conferred financial powers to Dean and approved the purchase of vehicles, Franking Machines, hiring vans and policy decisions on pay structure of teaching staff and admission of candidates, into B.Sc.(Ag.) Programme.



After the registration of the society several bodies such as Governing Body, General Body, Equipment and Purchase Committee, Executive Committee, Finance Committee, Academic Committee and Building Committee came into being. The Governing Body met thrice already during the year. Details of the meetings are as follows:

The Governing Body approved the action taken on the basis of the direction from the Transitory Body and further purchases of lab articles, vehicles and furniture for the college. It also approved the increase in staff strength for offering courses, of second year B.Sc.(Ag.). It considered the progress reports of the college and accepted them.

The Equipment and Purchase Committee convened three meetings on 16.5.88, 19.9.88 and 25.1.89. It approved items costing more than Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten thousand only). The items approved by the Purchase Committee are furniture, electronic typewriter, mini buses, library books, microscopes, insect boxes, motor cycle, electronic balances, power tiller, weighing machines, photometers and spectrophotometer.

The Dean of the college joined on 28.9.87 on deputation from Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore. Subsequently, the Professor of Agricultural Botany on deputation from Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore joined this college on 24.10.87. The administrative work such as drawal of pay and allowances, purchase of materials, and printing of applications were attended to initially by the Dean and the Professor of Agricultural Botany. They were assisted by a Junior Assistant and one typist on daily wages lent from the office of the Additional Director of Agriculture, Karaikal. In the month of November'87 the following staff members joined this college:

Among the seven teaching staff six were deputed from Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, and one from Kerala Agricultural University. The Lower Division Clerk was deputed from the Government of Pondicherry. As decided in the meeting of Secretaries to Government and affiliation team the Government of Pondicherry was approached on the deputation of ministerial staff to look after the administration of the college. The following administrative staff joined this college.

The Arignar Anna Government Arts College was approached for utilising the services of the lecturers in English, Mathematics, and Economics on part time basis to offer some of the courses on basic subjects in the first year.

EDUCATION:

(i) First Batch(1987-88)

The Notification for admission of first batch of students into B.Sc.(Ag.) degree programme of the college was published in the leading dailies on November 3 & 5, 1987. The last date for receipt of applications was fixed on 30.11.'87. A total number of 1,447 applications were sold. But 1,044 applications alone were received from the candidates. Out of 1,044 applications 798 applications comprising 102 from Union Territory of Pondicherry and 696 from other states were found to be eligible for admission into the degree programme. The applications were processed at the Computer Centre of the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University. The computer listed out eligible candidates for different reservation categories on merit basis. Candidates were selected on the basis of merit from the different categories namely open competition, backward classes, scheduled caste, son of farmers, freedom fighter, defence personnel, physically handicapped and sports persons. Fifty candidates in all comprising of 38 from Union Territory of Pondicherry and 12 from other states were admitted to the college in the first batch. Details of number of candidates admitted under different reservation categories and their cut-off marks are as follows:

The system of instruction is the TRIMESTER COURSE CREDIT SYSTEM with total self evaluation. The degree programme runs over four years comprising 11 trimesters.

The first trimester of I B.Sc.(Ag.) for the first batch of students commences on 15.2.88 and closed on 12.5.88. During this trimester, the students were offered courses in Agronomy, Crop Physiology, English, Mathematics, and Economics. The services of the lecturers of the Arignar Anna Government Arts College were utilised for offering the courses in English, Mathematics and Economics.

The second trimester was started on 23.5.88. During the trimester, the courses in Agricultural Entomology, Biochemistry, Agronomy, Soil Science and Agricultural Chemistry, Agricultural Botany and Physics, were offered to the students. The courses were handled by the staff of the Agricultural College. The trimester came to an end on 24.8.88 and vacation of 40 days was declared for the first year students.

(ii) Second batch(1988-89)

The advertisement for the admission of second batch of students in the academic year 1988-89 was released on June 24 & 28, 1988. The last date for receipt of applications was fixed on 28.7.88.

A total number of 1,299 applications were sold. But 867 applications were received from the candidates. Out of 867 applications 739 applications comprising 132 from U.T.of Pondicherry and 607 from other states were found to be eligible for admission into the degree programme. The applications were processed at Computer Centre of the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University and list of the eligible candidates for different categories of reservation on merit basis were drawn from the computer. Candidates were selected on the basis of merit from the different categories namely open competition, backward class, scheduled caste, sons of farmers, freedom fighter, defence personnel, physically handicapped and sports person. Fifty candidates in all comprising of 38 from Union Territory of Pondicherry and 12 from other states were admitted to the college in the second batch. Details of number of candidates admitted under different reservation categories and cut-off marks are as follows:

#### RESEARCH:

The technical staff are also involved in research projects. The research projects are designed in such a manner so as to meet the requirements of the farmers of the Karaikal region.

Twelve research projects have been formulated with a view to identify, the best rice variety for the tract, remunerative rice based cropping system, pests and diseases and their control, crop husbandry techniques especially with reference to fertilisers, micronutrients, and herbicides and the lacuna in dissemination of the improved techniques to the farming community.

Details of the research projects are as follows:

A. Agricultural Botany:

1. Evaluation of medium and long duration rice varieties.
2. Evaluation of advanced cultures of medium duration rice varieties.
3. Stability studies in rice varieties.
4. Effect of hydrocortisone for the Photosynthetic efficiency at structural and functional level in rice.
5. Effect of hydrocortisone on growth, development and yield under moisture stress condition.

B. Agronomy:

6. Alternate Cropping system for Karaikal region.
7. Effect of different combination of herbicides on transplanted paddy.

C. Soil Science:

8. Evaluation of Zinc requirement for rice in Karaikal region.
9. Evaluation of major nutrients requirement in coastal saline alkali soils of Karaikal region.

D. Agricultural Entomology:

10. Rice pest surveillance with light trap and fixed plot survey.
11. Rice leaf folder species complex identification and differential susceptibility to insecticides.
12. Screening for Rice pest resistance.

EXTENSION:

The staff of the college participate actively in all the extension activities involving extension functionaries and farmers in the region organised by the Department of Agriculture, Karaikal. Besides, Adaptive Research Trials on Varieties, and crop management techniques are laid out in the farmers' field for their benefit.

INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES:

(i) Laboratory:

Chemicals, glassware article and lab equipments like microscopes are being procured and utilised for conducting practical classes. Farm implements of different types have been procured and demonstrated to the students. They are also utilised for farm work. A class room has been established in the instructional farm for initiation of practical classes.

(ii) Library:

Book exhibitions were organised with the help of leading publishing agencies and 554 scientific books have been purchased for the college library for the benefit of students and staff.

(iii) Office equipments:

Office equipments such as typewriter, photocopier and duplicating machine have been purchased for effective functioning of the office.

(iv) Furniture:

Initially the class room furniture were taken on loan from Arignar Anna Government Arts College for conducting the classes. Subsequently, a hall available in the office of the Chief Educational Officer was also utilised for conducting lecture classes. The furniture available in the hall are being utilised by the college. Arrangements for the purchase of adequate number of tables, chairs for the staff, tables and chairs for class rooms/laboratories and furniture for hostels have been made. So far 90 per cent of the furniture have been purchased and utilised for the purposes intended.

(v) Transport facilities:

Since instructional farm, hostels and class rooms are located away from each other, two mini buses and one pickup van were purchased for the transport facilities of the students and materials. Besides, a car and jeep have been purchased for the mobilisation of the Dean and his staff. One motor cycle and one moped have been purchased for the movement of farm manager and other staff members from the college to farm and vice versa.

## LAND:

23

An area of 96.56 ha. have been chosen for establishing the college at Sorakudy and Suprayapurem villages. This site have been recommended by the Accreditation Committee appointed by the Indian Council of Agricultural Research and the affiliation Team of Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore for the establishment of the college. A special land acquisition cell has been formed with a Tahsildar as the leader of the team for the purpose of land acquisition. The land acquisition is in progress and documents relating to 4.1 - notification is under processing for publication in the gazette of Government of Pondicherry.

## FINANCE:

The Government of Pondicherry was kind enough to release funds to the tune of Rs.60 lakhs (Rupees Sixty lakhs only) in six instalments from the inception of the college. Details are as follows:

TO CONSIDER REVISION OF CERTAIN ASPECTS IN ADMISSION INTO PAJANCOA, KARAİKAL.

As per the G.O.Ms.No.46/Ag, dt.8.12.87 of the Chief Secretariat (Agriculture), Government of Pondicherry, the initial admission strength of the college was fixed as 50(fifty only). Seventy five per cent of the seats were allotted to the candidates from Union Territory of Pondicherry. Therefore thirty eight seats are available for them. These thirty eight seats are shared at 51 per-cent for open-competition and 49 per cent for other reservations.

If the number of seats are rounded, it works out to 19 which is exactly 50 per cent of the allotted seats. This is managed with marginal adjustment by allotting 20 seats under open competition. But this results in 52.6 per cent allotment for open competition. This may be revised by indicating number of seats under different reservation categories instead of per-centage and also increasing the admission strength marginally.

This college can also cater the needs of the residents of Union Territory of Lakshadweep and Andaman and Nicobar Islands which are located in the southern part of the country. Since these Union Territories do not have agricultural colleges and backward in education, a few seats may be reserved exclusively for them in this college.



In Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, three seats are reserved for the children of staff members of the University. Therefore one or two seats may be reserved for the children of the staff working in this college.

Taking into consideration the foregoing suggestions the admission strength of the college may be increased to 60 (sixty only).

Eligibility for admission to B.Sc.(Agriculture) Degree Course:

Pattern of admission:

75% per cent of the total seats will be filled up by the students from the Union Territory of Pondicherry and remaining 25 per cent from amongst the students from rest of India, students from Indian States/Union Territories lacking such facilities etc., during the academic year 1989-90.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATION FOR ADMISSION:

a) Academic Stream:

- i) A minimum of 60 per cent in Zoology and Botany taken together or 60 per cent in Biology.
- ii) A minimum of 60 per cent in Physics and Chemistry taken together, and
- iii) The aggregate of (i) and (ii) above should not be less than 70 per cent.

U) Vocational Stream:

- i) A minimum of 60 per cent in Biology or Chemistry or Economics.
- ii) A minimum of 60 per cent in any one of the Vocational subjects under Agriculture viz., Agricultural chemicals/Crop Production/Plant Protection/ Small Farm Management/Sericulture and Apiculture/Vegetables and Fruits/ Floriculture and Medicinal Plants; and
- iii) The aggregate of (i) and (ii) above should not be less than 70 per cent.

AGE LIMIT:

Candidates should have completed the age of 16 years on the 15th July, 1989.

CRITERIA FOR DOMICILE:

An applicant is considered to be a Pondicherry resident provided that he/she is an Indian National and satisfies atleast one of the following criteria:

(A) Those candidates/parents are residing continuously in the Union territory for atleast five years immediately preceding the date of application.

(B) Those who have passed SSLC/Matriculation/Brevet or any other higher Public Examination and had for that purpose undergone academic studies continuously for three successive classes in a recognised educational institution located in the Union Territory and having their residence in the Union territory for three years continuously during the period.



(C) Children of Pondicherry State Government employees (including those on deputation from Central or State Government).

(D) Children of Central Government Servants/Defence Personnel/Employees of Public Sector undertakings, wholly or substantially, run either by the Central Government or by the Pondicherry Administration posted in Pondicherry at the time of application or who have declared Union Territory of Pondicherry as their home town and so certified by their respective Head of Office.

(E) Children of Defence Personnel who were killed or disabled in action and children of the Central Government servants/Defence Personnel Employees of Public Sector undertakings as referred to in category (D) who dies while in service in Pondicherry.

(F) French Nationals residing in the Union territory of Pondicherry and covered by the terms of Treaty of Cession shall be treated on par with the candidates who produce the prescribed Pondicherry State Residence Certificate. Such French Nationals will not be required to produce a Residence Certificate but instead should produce a Certificate of Registration issued for this purpose from the French Consulate at Pondicherry. These children of French National shall not be considered for admission under the quota for non-residents.

WARDS OF FARMERS:

Candidates who wish to apply for the seats reserved for sons of farmers should satisfy the following conditions and produce necessary certificate from Officers of Revenue Department not lower than the rank of Tahsildar:-

1. The parent/guardian of the candidates does not own more than 5 acres of dry land or  $2\frac{1}{2}$  acres of garden/wet land.
2. The parent/guardian of the candidates is actually engaged in Agricultural Farming.
3. He does not have annual income more than Rs.10,000/- from all sources; and
4. He resides in Village/Town in the Union Territory of Pondicherry.

TO CONSIDER THE RECRUITMENT OF JUNIOR GRADE STENOGRAPHER.

While staff requirement for starting the college was considered, provision was made for appointment of senior grade stenographer. Since none of the senior grade stenographer opted to join this college on deputation, the Governing Body was approached and the post was converted into junior grade stenographer at its third meeting. With the increase of the activities of the college, it is felt that the recruitment of a junior grade stenographer is essential. So far this item of work is managed with the help of employees on casual basis. Therefore a junior grade stenographer may be recruited adopting the recruitment rules prescribed for the said post by the Government of Pondicherry.

The Governing Body is requested to consider the proposal and to permit the Dean to call for the list of names from the Employment Exchange and recruit a junior grade stenographer observing the rules prescribed for such recruitment in the Government of Pondicherry.

TO CONSIDER HIRING OUT OF A BUILDING OF THE PONDICHERRY HOUSING BOARD ON RENT FOR PAJANCOA, KARAIKAL.

It is proposed to hire out a hall(6.84m x 19.31m) in the first floor of the Shopping Complex of Pondicherry Housing Board at Nehru Nagar, Karaikal for establishing a laboratory for PAJANCOA, Karaikal. The authorities of the Housing Board were contacted and they have agreed to spare the hall at a monthly rent of Rs.2,700/- (Rupees two thousand and seven hundred only). They have also agreed to fix wash basins, plugs of high amperes and temporary partition to house the equipments required for conducting practical classes, provided, a monthly rent of Rs.2,700/- (Rupees two thousand and seven hundred only) is accepted.

This hall is fairly large and suitable for organising the practical classes involving agriculture oriented subjects. As this building belongs to Pondicherry Housing Board which is a Government of Pondicherry undertaking, the monthly rent claimed by them may be accepted.

The Governing Body is requested to consider the proposal and permit the Dean to hire out the first floor of the Shopping Complex of Pondicherry Housing Board on a monthly rent of Rs.2,700/- (Rupees two thousand and seven hundred only).

## TO CONSIDER THE RECRUITMENT OF STORE KEEPER FOR PAJANCOA, KARAIKAL

Courses covering all the agricultural subjects are being offered at present. In order to impart proper knowledge and training, large amount of equipments, chemicals, glasswares have been purchased. Besides, the strength of teaching staff has risen to 13. It is expected by the end of this year, the strength of teaching staff will reach 15. So, with the increase in the number of teaching staff, students of 2 batches (1987-88 and 1988-89) large amount of furniture have been purchased for equipping classrooms, laboratories and provide facilities for teachers. With the ever growing activity of the college, it is felt at this juncture that one post of store keeper may be created for maintaining the accounts of furniture, equipments and chemicals.

The Governing Body is requested to consider the proposal and permit the Dean to recruit a store keeper for PAJANCOA, Karaikal, observing the rules prescribed for such recruitment in the Government of Pondicherry.

TO CONSIDER THE CONTINUATION OF SERVICE OF THE DEAN, PAJANCOA,  
KARAIKAL.

The Dean, PAJANCOA, Karaikal was deputed by the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore and he had joined the post on 28.9.1987. As per the terms of appointment issued to the incumbent by Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore, the term of deputation is for three years from the date of assumption of charges. Since he had attained super-annuation on 29.2.1988, the fact was reported to Government of Pondicherry for taking decision on the continuance of service of the incumbent. The Government of Pondicherry after careful consideration <sup>gave</sup> approval to continue the services of Dr.N.Natarajaratnam as Dean, PAJANCOA, Karaikal on re-employment basis for one year from 1.3.88 was given as per Government letter No.I/32011/14/87/AG/A3, dt.4.3.88.

Since the college is in developing stage and the land acquisition is in progress, continuance of the service of the present incumbent may be helpful in organising the college on sound footing. The Governing Body is requested to consider further period of re-employment of the individual.
